A BILL

To direct the Consumer Product Safety Commission to implement children’s product safety recommendations of the Government Accountability Office.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Lead in Toys Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. CHILDREN’S PRODUCT SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS.**

6 (a) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term “chil-
7 dren’s product safety recommendations” means the rec-
8 ommendations set forth in the report of the Government
9 Accountability Office entitled “Consumer Product Safety

1 Commission: Opportunities to Strengthen Oversight of
2 Toxic Substances in Children’s Products”, which was pub-
3 lished on January 22, 2026.

4 (b) IMPLEMENTATION.—Not later than 180 days
5 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Consumer
6 Product Safety Commission shall implement the children’s
7 product safety recommendations, including—

8 (1) establishing a plan to oversee compliance
9 with applicable e-filing requirements;

10 (2) establishing a process for using violations
11 data to assess risks associated with independent and
12 government laboratories;

13 (3) reviewing applicable lead requirements and
14 documenting a process for completing such reviews
15 every 5 years; and

16 (4) documenting a process for keeping up-to-
17 date on changes related to phthalates and other
18 toxic substances.

19 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 60 days after the date
20 on which the Consumer Product Safety Commission imple-
21 ments the recommendations pursuant to subsection (b),
22 the Chairman of the Consumer Product Safety Commis-
23 sion shall submit to the Committee on Commerce, Science,
24 and Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on
25 Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives

- 1 a report that explicitly describes the steps taken by the
- 2 Commission to complete such implementation.
