## JOINT RESOLUTION

Providing for congressional disapproval of the proposed foreign military sale to the Government of Qatar of certain defense articles and services.

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That the following proposed foreign military sale to the  
4       Government of Qatar is prohibited:
