RESOLUTION

Condemning the commutation of the death sentence of
Marvin Charles Gabrion II granted by President Biden
on December 23, 2024.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. SENSE OF THE SENATE REGARDING THE COM-**

3 **MUTATION OF THE DEATH SENTENCE OF**

4 **MARVIN CHARLES GABRION II GRANTED BY**

5 **PRESIDENT BIDEN ON DECEMBER 23, 2024.**

6 It is the sense of the Senate that—

7 (1) President Joseph R. Biden undermined the

8 rule of law and robbed victims of justice when he

9 commuted the death sentence of Marvin Charles

10 Gabrion II on December 23, 2024;

1 (2) Marvin Gabrion was sentenced to death for
2 murdering 19-year-old Rachel Timmerman just 2
3 days before she was scheduled to testify that
4 Gabrion had abducted and raped her;

5 (3) Marvin Gabrion was also the prime suspect
6 in the disappearance and murder of several other in-
7 dividuals, including Rachel Timmerman's 11-month-
8 old daughter and 2 potential witnesses at his rape
9 trial;

10 (4) this commutation is a reprehensible insult
11 to the victims of Marvin Gabrion;

12 (5) President Biden claimed that he commuted
13 the death sentences of Marvin Gabrion and 36 other
14 murderers out of a principled opposition to the death
15 penalty but refused to commute the death sentences
16 of the 3 most controversial death row inmates, dem-
17 onstrating that President Biden was motivated by
18 politics, not principles; and

19 (6) the Senate unequivocally condemns this
20 commutation.

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
