UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS**H.R. 6 (ORDER NO. 9)**

1.—*Ordered*, That at 3:30 p.m. on Monday, June 11, 2007, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to H.R. 6, an act to reduce our Nation's dependency on foreign oil by investing in clean, renewable, and alternative energy resources, promoting new emerging energy technologies, developing greater efficiency, and creating a Strategic Energy Efficiency and Renewables Reserve to invest in alternative energy, and for other purposes; further, that the time until 4:30 p.m. shall be equally divided and controlled between the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

Ordered further, That relative to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to H.R. 6, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*June 7, 2007.*)

S.J. RES. 14 (ORDER NO. 179)

2.—*Ordered*, That at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 11, 2007, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 14, a joint resolution expressing the sense of the Senate that Attorney General Alberto Gonzales no longer holds the confidence of the Senate and of the American people; provided that the time until 5:30 p.m. shall be equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees; further, that at 5:30 p.m. without intervening action or debate, the Senate proceed to a vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 14.

Ordered further, That relative to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 14, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*June 7, 2007.*)
