PENDING BUSINESS

H.R. 3221 (ORDER NO. 340)

An act moving the United States toward greater energy independence and security, developing innovative new technologies, reducing carbon emissions, creating green jobs, protecting consumers, increasing clean renewable energy production, and modernizing our energy infrastructure, and to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide tax incentives for the production of renewable energy and energy conservation. (*Apr. 3, 2008.*)

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

H.R. 3221 (CALENDAR NO. 340)

1.—*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of Morning Business on Thursday, April 10, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of H.R. 3221, an act moving the United States toward greater energy independence and security, developing innovative new technologies, reducing carbon emissions, creating green jobs, protecting consumers, increasing clean renewable energy production, and modernizing our energy infrastructure; provided, that the Senate proceed to vote in relation to the following amendments, in the order listed, and that if a point of order is raised against an amendment, there be two minutes of debate prior to a vote on the motion to waive the point of order, equally divided and controlled in the usual form: Amdt. No. 4429, offered by the Senator from Tennessee (Mr. Alexander); Amdt. No. 4419, offered by the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Ensign), as amended, if amended; provided further, that the Senator from Tennessee (Mr. Alexander) and the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Ensign), be recognized for five minutes each for consideration of the amendments.

Ordered further, That upon disposition of the listed amendments, the substitute, as amended, be agreed to and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; provided, that upon disposition of the substitute amendment, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate vote on passage of the bill, without further intervening action or debate; provided further, that upon passage of the bill, the title amendment at the desk be agreed to. (*Apr. 9, 2008.*)

S. 2739 (ORDER NO. 616)

2.—*Ordered*, That upon disposition of H.R. 3221, the Senate proceed to S. 2739, a bill to authorize certain programs and activities in the Department of the Interior, the Forest Service, and the Department of Energy, to implement further the act approving the Covenant to Establish a Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands in Political Union with the United States of America, to amend the Compact of Free Association Amendments Act of 2003, and for other purposes; provided, that when the bill is considered, the only first-degree amendments in order be the Amdt. Nos. 4519, 4520, 4521, 4522 offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn) with no other amendments in order.

Ordered further, That there be a total of two hours for debate with respect to the amendments, equally divided and controlled in the usual form, and that upon the disposition of the amendments, the bill be read a third time with no intervening action and the Senate proceed to vote on passage of the bill, as amended, if amended.

Ordered further, That the order with respect to S. 2483, a bill to authorize certain programs and activities in the Forest Service, the Department of the Interior, and the Department of Energy, and for other purposes, be vitiated. (*Apr. 9, 2008.*)

S. 1974

3.—*Ordered*, That S. 1974, a bill to make technical corrections related to the Pension Protection Act of 2006, remain at the desk. (*Mar. 31, 2008.*)

S. 2483 (ORDER NO. 546)

4.—*Ordered*, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, following consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to the consideration of S. 2483, a bill to authorize certain programs and activities in the Forest Service, the Department of the Interior, and the Department of Energy, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That it be considered under the following limitations: that the only amendments in order be five related amendments to be offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn), and that upon disposition of all amendments, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate proceed to vote in the passage of the bill. (*Dec. 19, 2007.*)

VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

5.—*Ordered*, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (*June 20, 2007.*)

H.R. 3997

6.—*Ordered*, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance. (*Dec. 12, 19, 2007.*)
