PENDING BUSINESS

S. 3268 (ORDER NO. 882)

A bill to amend the Commodity Exchange Act to prevent excessive price speculation with respect to energy commodities, and for other purposes. (*July 23, 2008.*)

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 3186 (ORDER NO. 835)

1.—*Ordered*, That at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, July 24, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S. 3186, a bill to provide funding for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, and for other purposes; provided, that the time until 10:30 a.m. be equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees, with the Majority controlling the first half of time and the Republicans controlling the final half; provided further, that the time from 10:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. be equally divided and controlled by the two Leaders or their designees, with the time controlled in 30-minute alternating blocks of time, with the Majority controlling the first 30 minutes and the Republicans controlling the next 30 minutes.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*July 23, 2008.*)

S. 3268 (ORDER NO. 882)

2.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on S. 3268, a bill to amend the Commodity Exchange Act, to prevent excessive price speculation with respect to energy commodities, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*July 23, 2008.*)

6.—*Ordered*, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance.
