UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 3001 (ORDER NO. 732)

1.—*Ordered*, That at 10:30 a.m. on Thursday, July 31, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S. 3001, an original bill to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2009 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes; provided, that the time until 12:30 be divided in alternating 30 minute blocks, with the Republicans controlling the first block of time.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*July 30, 2008.*)

S. 1974

2.—*Ordered*, That S. 1974, a bill to make technical corrections related to the Pension Protection Act of 2006, remain at the desk. (*Mar. 31, 2008.*)

VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

3.—*Ordered*, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (*June 20, 2007.*)

H.R. 3997

4.—*Ordered*, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance. (*Dec. 12, 19, 2007.*)
