**PENDING BUSINESS**

S. 3268 (ORDER NO. 882)

A bill to amend the Commodity Exchange Act to prevent excessive price speculation with respect to energy commodities, and for other purposes. (*July 23, 2008.*)

**UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS**

S. 3001 (ORDER NO. 732)

1.—*Ordered*, That at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, September 8, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S. 3001, an original bill to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2009 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*July 30, Aug. 1, 2008.*)

S. 1974

2.—*Ordered*, That S. 1974, a bill to make technical corrections related to the Pension Protection Act of 2006, remain at the desk. (*Mar. 31, 2008.*)

H.R. 3997

4.—*Ordered*, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance. (*Dec. 12, 19, 2007.*)
