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**UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT**

H.R. 4851 (ORDER NO. 323)

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of Morning Business on Wednesday, April 14, 2010, the Senate resume consideration of H.R. 4851, an act to provide a temporary extension of certain programs, and for other purposes, with the time until 12:30 p.m. equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees; provided, that during this time, it be in order for the Republican Leader, or his designee to make a relevant Budget Act point of order against Amdt. No. 3721, offered by the Senator from Montana (Mr. Baucus); provided further, that after the point of order is made, the Senator from Montana (Mr. Baucus), or his designee, be recognized to move to waive the applicable point of order and the vote on the motion to waive the budget point of order occur at 12:30 p.m.; further, that no intervening motions or amendments be in order during this period of debate; further, that it be in order for the Senator from Montana (Mr. Baucus) to modify Amdt. No. 3721 with the provision which covers the extension of small business programs. (*Apr. 13, 2010.*)

When following the objection to a unanimous consent to proceeding to, and, or passage of, a measure or matter on their behalf, a Senator has notified the appropriate leader, or their designee, in writing and submits such objection for inclusion in the Congressional Record and the Senate Calendar of Business, it shall be placed in the section of the Calendar entitled "Notice of Intent to Object to Proceeding".
