S. 3217 (ORDER NO. 349)

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of Morning Business on Monday, May 10, 2010, the Senate resume consideration of S. 3217, an original bill to promote the financial stability of the United States by improving accountability and transparency in the financial system, to end “too big to fail”, to protect the American taxpayer by ending bailouts, to protect consumers from abusive financial services practices, and for other purposes; provided, that the next amendment in order be a Democratic side-by-side to the McCain GSE amendment. *(May 6, 7, 2010.)*
