UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

S. RES. 14

Ordered, That S. Res. 14, a resolution honoring the victims of the shooting on January 8, 2011 in Tucson, Arizona, remain at the desk; provided, that at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, January 26, 2011, the Senate proceed to the immediate consideration of the resolution and that there be three and a half hours of debate equally divided and controlled between the Majority Leader and Republican Leader, or their designees; provided further, that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on adoption of the resolution; provided further, that there be no amendments, motions or points of order in order prior to the vote on adoption; further, that if the resolution is adopted, the preamble be agreed to and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate.
