Ordered, That upon the conclusion of the remarks of the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. Paul) on Wednesday, February 2, 2011, the Senate resume consideration of S. 223, a bill to modernize the air traffic control system, improve the safety, reliability, and availability of transportation by air in the United States, provide for modernization of the air traffic control system, reauthorize the Federal Aviation Administration, and for other purposes; provided, that Amdt. No. 9, offered by the Senator from Michigan (Ms. Stabenow) and Amdt. No. 13, offered by the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. McConnell), be debated concurrently. (*Feb. 1, 2011.*)
