*Ordered,* That following any Leader remarks on Saturday, July 30, 2011, the Senate resume consideration of the House Message to accompany S. 627, an act to establish the Commission on Freedom of Information Act Processing Delays; provided that the time from 1:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. be equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees in alternating 30 minute blocks of time with the Majority controlling the first block of time; provided further, that the time from 7:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. be equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees with the Republicans controlling the first 15 minutes and the Majority controlling the final 15 minutes. *(July 29, 2011.)*

After an action taken by the Senate, any Senator voting with the prevailing side or who has not voted may, on the same day or on either of the next two days of actual session thereafter, either enter a motion for reconsideration or move a reconsideration.
