## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### H.R. 674 (ORDER NO. 212)

1.—*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of consideration of the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 6 on Wednesday, November 9, 2011, the Senate resume consideration of H.R. 674, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to repeal the imposition of 3 percent withholding on certain payments made to vendors by government entities, to modify the calculation of modified adjusted gross income for purposes of determining eligibility for certain healthcare-related programs, and for other purposes; provided, that the Senator from Arizona (Mr. McCain) be recognized to offer Amdt. No. 928.

*Ordered further*, That at 2:15 p.m. on Thursday, November 10, 2011, the Senate resume consideration of H.R. 674; provided, that there be up to 15 minutes of debate on the bill and amendments to run concurrently, with the time equally divided between their two Leaders or designees; provided further, that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to votes in relation to the amendments in the following order:

—McCain Amdt. No. 928

—Reid (on behalf of Tester) Amdt. No. 927.

*Ordered further*, That the McCain and Reid amendments be subjected to a 60 affirmative vote threshold; provided, that upon disposition of the amendments, the bill be read a third time and the Senate proceed to vote on passage of the bill, as amended, if amended; provided further, that no other amendments, points of order or motions be in order to the amendments or the bill prior to the votes, other than budget points of order and the applicable motions to waive. (*Nov. 8, 2011.*)

### S.J. RES. 6 (ORDER NO. 219)

2.—*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of Morning Business on Wednesday, November 9, 2011, the Republican Leader or his designee, be recognized to move to proceed to S.J. Res. 6, a joint resolution disapproving the rule submitted by the Federal Communications Commission with respect to regulating the Internet and broadband industry practices; provided, that there be four hours of debate, equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.

*Ordered further*, That at 12:00 noon on Thursday, November 10, 2011, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 6; provided, that there be up to five minutes of debate equally divided between the Leaders or their designees prior to a vote on adoption of the motion to proceed.

*Ordered further*, That if the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 6 is adopted, further debate and votes on the joint resolution be deferred until 2:15 p.m. on Tuesday, November 15, 2011, with all other provisions of the previous order regarding the joint resolution remaining in effect.

*Ordered further*, That all other provisions of the statute governing consideration of the joint resolution remain in effect. (*Nov. 3, 8, 2011.*)

### S.J. RES. 27 (ORDER NO. 220)

3.—*Ordered*, That at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 10, 2011, the Republican Leader or his designee, be recognized to move to proceed to S.J. Res. 27, a joint resolution disapproving a rule submitted by the Environmental Protection Agency relating to the mitigation by States of cross-border air pollution under the Clean Air Act; provided, that there be two hours of debate, equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees.

*Ordered further*, That following the vote on adoption of the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 6 on Thursday, November 10, 2011, the Senate vote on the adoption of the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 27; provided, that there be two minutes of debate equally divided in the usual form prior to the vote.

*Ordered further*, That if the motion to proceed is to S.J. Res. 27 is adopted, further debate and votes on the joint resolution be deferred until 2:15 p.m. on Tuesday, November 15, 2011, with all other provisions of the previous order regarding the joint resolution remaining in effect.

*Ordered further*, That all other provisions of the statute governing consideration of the joint resolution remain in effect. (*Nov. 3, 8, 2011.*)

## H.R. 2354 (ORDER NO. 157)

4.—*Ordered*, That upon disposition of H.R. 674 on Thursday, November 10, 2011, the Senate proceed to vote on adoption of the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to H.R. 2354, an act making appropriations for energy and water development and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, and for other purposes.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to H.R. 2354, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Nov. 8, 2011.*)
