H.R. 1 (ORDER NO. 14)

An act making appropriations for the Department of Defense and the other departments and agencies of the Government for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, and for other purposes. (*Dec. 17, 2012.*)

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

H.R. 5949 (ORDER NO. 510)

1.—*Ordered*, That notwithstanding cloture having been invoked, and following any Leader remarks on Thursday, December 27, 2012, the Senate proceed to the consideration of H.R. 5949, an act to extend the FISA Amendments Act of 2008 for five years; provided, that the Senator from Oregon (Mr. Wyden) be recognized; provided further, that the only first degree amendments in order to the bill be the following, the texts of which are at the desk:

- Leahy (Judiciary committee reported substitute),
- Merkley (declassification of FISA court opinions),
- Paul (4th Amendment—searches/seizures),
- Wyden (public reporting).

Ordered further, That there be 30 minutes of debate equally divided and controlled between the proponents and opponents on each amendment and that there be up to seven hours of debate on the bill equally divided and controlled between the proponents and opponents; provided, that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote in relation to the amendments in the order listed; provided further, that there be no amendments in order to any of the amendments prior to the votes; further, that upon disposition of the amendments, the bill be read a third time and the Senate vote on passage of the bill, as amended, if amended; further, that there be a 60 affirmative vote threshold for each of the amendments and for passage of the bill. (*Dec. 21, 2012.*)

H.R. 1 (ORDER NO. 14)

2.—*Ordered*, That when the Senate resumes consideration of H.R. 1, an act making appropriations for the Department of Defense and the other departments and agencies of the Government for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, and for other purposes; provided, that notwithstanding Rule XXII, the following amendments be in order:

- Cardin #3393 (surety bonds),
- Grassley #3348 (DOJ—vehicles),
- Feinstein #3421 (Army Corps projects), as modified with the changes at the desk,
- Harkin #3426 (technical—grants),
- Landrieu #3415 (emergency reimbursement),
- Leahy #3403 (U.S. embassy security),
- McCain #3384 (Amtrak), as modified,
- Bingaman #3344 (Palau),
- Coburn #3368 (cost sharing—Army Corps),
- Coburn #3369 (notification triggers),
- Coburn #3370 (delinquent tax debts and fisheries), as modified and with two divisions,
- Coburn #3371 (severe disasters),
- Coburn #3382 (merit based recovery contracts),
- Coburn #3383 (strike certain studies—Army Corps),
- Tester #3350 (fire management),
- Paul #3376 (non-application of Davis-Bacon),
- Paul #3410 (offset),
- McCain #3355 (strike emergency forest restoration),
- Merkley #3367 (extend agriculture disaster assistance programs), as modified,
- Lee #3373 (special rules—retirement funds), as modified,
- Coats #3391 (Republican alternative).

Ordered further, That no amendments be in order to any of these amendments prior to votes in relation to the amendments; provided, that the amendments be subject to a 60 affirmative vote threshold; provided further, that there be 30 minutes of debate equally divided and controlled in the usual form on each amendment with the exception of the following:

- 20 minutes equally divided on each of the Coburn amendments or divisions and the Lee Amdt. No. 3373,
- 40 minutes equally divided on each of the Paul amendments; and
- one hour equally divided on the Coats Amdt. No. 3391.

Ordered further, That upon the use or yielding back or time, the Senate vote in relation to the amendments in the order listed; provided, that there be two minutes of debate equally divided, between the votes, and that all after the first vote be 10 minute votes; provided further, that upon disposition of the pending amendments listed, the Senate vote in relation to Amdt. No. 3395, offered by the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Reid), as amended, if amended; provided further, that upon disposition of Amdt. No. 3395, the cloture motion

on H.R. 1 be withdrawn, the bill be read a third time and the Senate vote passage of H.R. 1, as amended, if amended.

Ordered further, That no further budget points of order be in order to the Amdt. No. 3395 or H.R. 1.

Ordered further, That the filing deadline for second degree amendments to Amdt. No. 3395 be 1:30 p.m. on December 21, 2012. (*Dec. 20, 21, 2012.*)

S. 3525 (ORDER NO. 504)

3.—*Ordered*, That S. 3525, a bill to protect and enhance opportunities for recreational hunting, fishing, and shooting, and for other purposes, be returned to the Calendar status quo; provided, that at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader after consultation with the Republican Leader, it be in order for the Majority Leader to resume consideration of S. 3525. (*Nov. 26, 2012.*)

S. 3220 (ORDER NO. 410)

4.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 3220, a bill to amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to provide more effective remedies to victims of discrimination in the payment of wages on the basis of sex, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*May 24, 2012.*)
