### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

#### H.R. 803

1.—Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Republican Leader, the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions be discharged from further consideration of H.R. 803, an Act to reform and strengthen the workforce investment system of the Nation to put Americans back to work and make the United States more competitive in the 21st century, and the Senate proceed to its consideration; provided, that a Murray-Isakson-Harkin-Alexander substitute amendment, which is at the desk, be considered; provided further, that the only other amendments in order be the following amendments to the substitute:

-Flake (making the appointment and certification of new local board permissible instead of required);

-Lee (evaluation report requirement);

-Managers' technical amendment.

Ordered further, That there be 10 minutes of debate equally divided between the two Leaders, or their designees, on each amendment; provided, that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote in relation to the amendments in the order listed; provided further, that no second degree amendments be in order prior to the votes; further, that upon disposition of the Managers' technical amendment, the substitute amendment, as amended, if amended, be agreed to, and the bill, as amended, be read a third time; provided further, that there be 10 minutes of debate equally divided between the two Leaders, or their designees; further, that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on passage of the bill, as amended.

Ordered further, That if the bill is passed, the Murray-Isakson-Harkin-Alexander amendment to the title, which is at the desk, be agreed to; provided, that the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate. (June 19, 2014.)

### ORDER WITH RESPECT TO S. RES. 470 (ORDER NO. 429)

2.—Ordered, That when the language of Title IV of S. 1681, as amended, is enacted into law, the Senate proceed to the consideration of S. Res. 470, a resolution to clarify the responsibility of committees of the Senate in the provision of the advice and consent of the Senate to nominations to positions in the intelligence community; provided, that the resolution be agreed to and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table without intervening action or debate. (June 11, 2014.)

#### S. 2432 (ORDER NO. 409)

3.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 2432, a bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to provide for the refinancing of certain Federal student loans, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (June 9, 2014.)

#### H.R. 3474 (ORDER NO. 332)

4.—Ordered, That the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII for the motion to invoke cloture on Amdt. No. 3060, offered by the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Reid), to H.R. 3474, an Act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow employers to exempt employees with health coverage under TRICARE or the Veterans Administration from being taken into account for purposes of the employer mandate under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, be waived; provided, that the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 15, 2014, and the filing deadline for second degree amendments be 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 15, 2014. (May 14, 2014.)

#### S. 2262 (ORDER NO. 368)

5.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on S. 2262, a bill to promote energy savings in residential buildings and industry, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived; provided, that the filing deadline for all second degree amendments be 4:30 p.m. on Monday, May 12. (May 7, 8, 2014.)

#### S. 2223 (ORDER NO. 354)

6.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 2223, a bill to provide for an increase in the Federal minimum wage and to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to extend expensing limitations and the treatment of certain real property as section 179 property, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Apr. 28, 2014.)

#### S. 2199 (ORDER NO. 345)

7.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 2199, a bill to amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to provide more effective remedies to victims of discrimination in the payment of wages on the basis of sex, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Apr. 7, 2014.)

#### S. 1845 (ORDER NO. 265)

8.—Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motions filed on February 4, 2014, the filing deadline for first degree amendments to S. 1845, a bill to provide for the extension of certain unemployment benefits, and for other purposes, be 9:45 a.m. on Thursday, February 6, 2014, and the filing deadline for second degree amendments to Amdt. No. 2714 and S. 1845 be 10:45 a.m. on Thursday, February 6, 2014; provided, that with respect to those cloture motions, the mandatory quorums required under Rule XXII be waived, and that Wednesday, February 5, 2014, count as an intervening day for the purposes of Rule XXII.

Ordered further, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on January 9, 2014, the filing deadline for first degree amendments to S. 1845 be 3:00 p.m. on Monday, January 13, 2014, and the filing deadline for second degree amendments to S. 1845 be 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, January 14, 2014; provided, that with respect to that cloture motion, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Jan. 9, 13, Feb. 4, 2014.)

#### S. 1197 (ORDER NO. 91)

9.—Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motion on S. 1197, an original bill to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2014 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. Ordered further, That the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 1:00 p.m. and that the filing deadline for second degree amendments be 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 21, 2013. (Nov. 20, 2013.)

### S. CON. RES. 8

10.—Ordered, That with respect to the conference on S. Con. Res. 8 an original concurrent resolution setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2014, revising the appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal year 2013, and setting forth the appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2015 through 2023, the conferences on the part of the Senate are instructed to report back a conference report by December 13, 2013.

Ordered further, That it not be in order for the Senate to consider a conference report with respect to H. Con. Res. 25 or S. Con. Res. 8 if it includes reconciliation instructions to raise the debt limit. (Oct. 16, 2013.)

#### S. 1569 (ORDER NO. 211)

11.—Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to S. 1569, a bill to ensure the complete and timely payment of the obligations of the United States Government until December 31, 2014, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Oct. 10, 2013.)

#### S. 1392 (ORDER NO. 154)

12.—Ordered, That with respect to S. 1392, a bill to promote energy savings in residential buildings and industry, and for other purposes; no amendments or motions be in order relative to Syria or the use of military force during consideration of the bill. (Sept. 11, 2013.)

### S. 1243 (ORDER NO. 99)

13.—Ordered, That the text of H.R. 2610, as reported by the House Appropriations Committee, be deemed House-passed text for the purposes of Rule XVI for S. 1243, an original bill making appropriations for the Departments of Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, and for other purposes.

2014, and for other purposes. Ordered further, That the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, July 31, 2013 and the filing deadline for second degree amendments be 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 1, 2013.

Ordered further, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on S. 1243, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (July 18, 31, 2013.)

#### S. 1238 (ORDER NO. 124)

14.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 1238, a bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to extend the current reduced interest rate for undergraduate Federal Direct Stafford Loans for 1 year, to modify required distribution rules for pension plans, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (July 8, 2013.)
