UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT**S. 1 (ORDER NO. 1)**

Ordered, That on Thursday, January 29, 2015 upon the conclusion of Morning Business, the Senate resume consideration of S. 1, a bill to approve the Keystone Pipeline; provided, that the pending Murkowski Amdt. No. 2 be considered original text for the purposes of further amendment; provided further, that there be 15 minutes equally divided in the usual form, and the Senate vote in relation to the following amendments in the order listed:

- Barrasso Amdt. No. 245;
- Cardin Amdt. No. 124;
- Daines Amdt. No. 246;
- Burr Amdt. No. 92, as modified;
- Vitter Amdt. No. 80, as further modified;
- Udall Amdt. No. 77.

Ordered further, That all amendments listed above be subject to a 60 vote affirmative threshold for adoption and that no second degree amendments be in order to the amendments; provided, that there be 2 minutes of debate equally divided between each vote; provided further, that all votes after the first in the series be 10 minute votes.

Ordered further, That upon disposition of all amendments listed above, the motion to proceed to the motion to reconsider the vote by which cloture was not invoked on S. 1 be agreed to, the motion to reconsider be agreed to, and the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on S. 1, upon reconsideration; provided, that if cloture is invoked on the bill, as amended, all time post-cloture be considered expired at 2:30 p.m.

Ordered further, That with respect to S. 1, the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 3 p.m. on Monday, January 26, 2015, and the filing deadline for second degree amendments be 5 p.m. on Monday, January 26, 2015.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on S. 1, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Jan. 23, 26, 28, 2015.*)
