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**UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS****S. 178 (ORDER NO. 26)**

1.—*Ordered*, That following Morning Business on Wednesday, March 18, 2015, the Senate resume consideration of S. 178, a bill to provide justice for the victims of trafficking.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture filed on March 12, 2015, the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 5:00 p.m. on Monday, March 16, 2015 and the filing deadline for second degree amendments be 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, March 17, 2015; provided, that with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on S. 178 and the motions to invoke cloture on the committee reported substitute to S. 178, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Mar. 12, 16, 17, 2015.*)

**S. 534 (ORDER NO. 22)**

2.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 534, a bill to prohibit funds from being used to carry out certain Executive actions related to immigration, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Feb. 27, 2015.*)
