UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

H.R. 6172 (ORDER NO. 440)

1.—*Ordered*, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader, the Senate proceed to the consideration of H.R. 6172, an Act to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to prohibit the production of certain business records, and for other purposes; provided, that there be 10 hours of debate, equally divided between the proponents and opponents of the bill with an hour of debate under the control of the sponsors of each amendment, or their designees, and with the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Oregon (Mr. Wyden) controlling one hour each; provided further, that the only amendments in order be the following to be proposed by the following Senators or their designees:

Lee—Amicus Reform and Exculpatory Evidence

Paul—Rights of Americans

Daines—Sec. 215 Web Browser/Search History Data Collection Prohibition

McConnell—3 side by side amendments on the same topics.

Ordered further, That all amendments and the bill be subject to a 60 affirmative vote threshold; provided, that upon the use or yielding back of time, and upon disposition of the amendments in the order listed, the bill, as amended, if amended, be read a third time, and the Senate vote on passage of the bill with no intervening action or debate. (March 16, 2020.)

S. 2657 (ORDER NO. 357)

2.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on Amdt. No. 1407, as modified, offered by the Senator from Alaska (Ms. Murkowski) and S. 2657, a bill to support innovation in advanced geothermal research and development, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum calls under Rule XXII be waived; provided, that the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 3:30 p.m. on Monday, March 9, 2020. (March 5, 2020.)

H.R. 2740 (ORDER NO. 140)

3.—*Ordered*, That the cloture motion with respect to the motion to proceed to H.R. 2740, an Act making appropriations for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, and for other purposes, filed on October 17, 2019, ripen at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, in concurrence with the Democratic Leader; provided, that with respect to the cloture motions on the motions to proceed, the mandatory quorum calls under Rule XXII be waived. (September 18, October 17, 22, 28, 2019.)

ARMS SALES DISAPPROVAL JOINT RESOLUTIONS (S.J. RESOLUTIONS 27–35, 39–48)

4.—*Ordered*, That if the Senate receives a veto message with respect to any or all of the following Joint Resolutions of Disapproval of Arms Sales, then notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, consideration of the veto message be limited to twenty-eight hours of concurrent debate for all messages:

Ordered further, That all remaining joint resolutions be voted on en bloc; provided, that the en bloc votes with respect to the override vote be shown separately for each resolution when printed in the Record. (June 19, July 29, 2019.)

S. 1370

5.—*Ordered*, That with respect to S. 1370, an Act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to treat certain military survivor benefits as earned income for purposes of the kiddie tax, the papers to be held at the Desk; provided, that if the House passes a bill identical to S. 1370, the House bill be considered read three times and passed; provided further, that the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, with no intervening action or debate; further, that upon passage of the House bill, S. 1370 be indefinitely postponed. (May 21, 2019.)

H.R. 268 (ORDER NO. 15)

6.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the cloture motions on Amdt. No. 201, offered by the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Shelby), and H.R. 268, an Act making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, the mandatory quorums under Rule XXII be waived; provided, that the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 4:00 p.m. on Monday, April 1, 2019. (Mar. 28, 2019.)

H.J. RES. 1 (ORDER NO. 6)

7.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the cloture motion on the motion to proceed to H.J. Res. 1, an Act making further continuing appropriations for the Department of Homeland Security for fiscal year 2019, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII be waived; provided, that notwithstanding Rule XXII, the vote on cloture on the motion to proceed to H.J. Res. 1 occur at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, in consultation with the Democratic Leader. (Feb. 11, 14, 2019.)
