Referred to Foreign Relations Jan. 26, 2023. Reported amended July 25, 2023; no written report. S. Con. Res. 7.— Condemning Russia’s unjust and arbitrary detention of Russian opposition leader Vladimir Kara-Murza who has stood up in defense of democracy, the rule of law, and free and fair elections in Russia. Referred to Foreign Relations Mar. 23, 2023. Reported amended May 4, 2023; no written report. Passed Senate amended Nov. 2, 2023. Received in House and held at desk Nov. 6, 2023. S. Con. Res. 25.— Providing for a correction in the enrollment of H.R. 2872. Passed Senate Jan. 18, 2024. Received in House and passed Jan. 18, 2024. S. Con. Res. 26.— Recognizing and supporting the efforts of the New Heights Bid Committee to bring the 2027 Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) Women’s World Cup competition to the United States and Mexico. Passed Senate Jan. 23, 2024. Received in House and held at desk Jan. 29, 2024. S. Con. Res. 29.— Providing for a correction in the enrollment of H.R. 815. Passed Senate Feb. 13 (Legislative day of Feb. 12), 2024. Received in House and held at desk Feb. 13, 2024. S. Con. Res. 33.— Authorizing the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for the lying in honor of the remains of Ralph Puckett, Jr., the last surviving Medal of Honor recipient for acts performed during the Korean conflict.
