## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

## S. 2226 (ORDER NO. 119)

1.-Ordered, That on Wednesday, July 26, 2023, upon the conclusion of Morning Business, the Senate resume consideration of S. 2226, a bill to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2024 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes; provided, that at 12:15 p.m., the Senate vote on Amdt. No. 199, to be offered by the Senator from Georgia (Mr. Warnock).

Ordered further, That 60 affirmative votes be required for the adoption of the amendment and there be two minutes for debate equally divided prior to the vote. (July 20, $25,2023$.

## S.J. RES. 4 (ORDER NO. 3)

2.-Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 4, a joint resolution removing the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (April 25, 2023.)

## S. 326 (ORDER NO. 32)

3.-Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 326, a bill to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out a study and clinical trials on the effects of cannabis on certain health outcomes of veterans with chronic pain and post-traumatic stress disorder, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (April 20, 2023.)
