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### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

## H.R. 4366 (ORDER NO. 198)

1.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to suspend Rule XVI for the consideration of Amdt. No. 1092, offered by the Senator from New York (Mr. Schumer), to H.R. 4366, an Act making appropriations for military construction, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (September 18, 2023.)

## S.J. RES. 4 (ORDER NO. 3)


2.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 4, a joint resolution removing the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (April 25, 2023.)

## S. 326 (ORDER NO. 32)

3.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 326, a bill to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out a study and clinical trials on the effects of cannabis on certain health outcomes of veterans with chronic pain and post-traumatic stress disorder, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived.
