H.J. RES. 24

1.—*Ordered*, That on Thursday, April 3, 2025, upon the conclusion of Morning Business, the Senate resume consideration of H.J. Res. 24, a joint resolution providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Energy relating to “Energy Conservation Program: Energy Conservation Standards for Walk-In Coolers and Walk-In Freezers;” provided, that all time be expired on the joint resolution at 11:00 a.m., and the Senate vote on passage of the joint resolution.
