JOHN W. OLVER, Democrat, of Amherst, MA; born on September 3, 1936 in Honesdale, PA; B.S., Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, 1955; M.A., Tufts University, 1956; taught for two years at Franklin Technical Institute, Boston, MA; Ph.D., Massachusetts Institute of Technology, 1961; chemistry professor, University of Massachusetts-Amherst; Massachusetts House, 1968–72; Massachusetts Senate, 1972–91; became first Democrat since the Spanish-American War to represent the First Congressional District, 1991; elected by special election on June 4, 1991 to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Silvio Conte; member: Budget Committee, Science Committee, Basic Research Subcommittee, Energy and Environment Subcommittee; married to Rose Olver; one daughter, Martha; elected on November 3, 1992 to the 103rd Congress; re-elected to each succeeding Congress.
