Kennedy School of Government; recognized for outstanding leadership in *Time* magazine, and in *Ebony* magazine as one of 50 Future Leaders; recipient, Pennsylvania Public Interest Coalition's State Legislator of the Year Award; Pennsylvania State Senate, 1988-94; State House of Representatives, 1982-88; created the Jobs Project; in Pennsylvania House of Representatives, sponsored 1987 Employment Opportunities Act; supported Ben Franklin Technology Center, a conduit for securing government contracts for African-American and women-owned businesses; founded Graduate Opportunities Conference; chairman of the executive committee of the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency; convened and led a task force, Child Development Initiative; supported measures to reform the Philadelphia Housing Authority; formed the Drug-Free Program; founded American Cities Conference and Foundation; trustee, Lincoln University and Community College of Philadelphia; member, Mt.
