

DELEGATES, REPRESENTATIVES, AND SENATORS SERVING IN THE 1st–105th CONGRESSES ¹

As of May 20, 1997, 11,538 individuals have served: 9,697 in the House of Representatives, 1,221 in the Senate, and 620 in both Houses. Total serving in the House of Representatives (including individuals serving in both bodies) is 10,316. Total for Senate (including individuals serving in both bodies) is 1,841.²

² Some of the larger states split into smaller states as the country grew westward (e.g., part of Virginia became West Virginia); hence, some individuals represented more than one state in the Congress.

³ North and South Dakota were formed from a single territory on the same date, and they shared the same delegates before statehood.

⁴ The Territory Northwest of the River Ohio was established as a district for purposes of temporary government by the Act of July 13, 1787. Virginia ceded the land beyond the Ohio River, and delegates representing the district first came to the 6th Congress, March 4, 1799.
