AL GORE, Democrat, of Carthage, TN; born March 31, 1948; graduated, Harvard University, 1969, with honors; attended Vanderbilt School of Religion, 1971–72; Vanderbilt Law School, 1974–76; engaged in homebuilding business; former investigative reporter and editorial writer; served in the U.S. Army, 1969–71; Vietnam veteran; member: Jaycees, American Legion, VFW, Farm Bureau; married the former Tipper Aitcheson, 1970; four children: Karenna, Kristin, Sarah, and Albert III; elected to the 95th Congress, November 2, 1976; reelected to three succeeding Congresses; elected to the U.S. Senate, November 6, 1984, for the term expiring January 3, 1991; reelected November 6, 1990; elected Vice President on November 3, 1992; resigned Senate seat on January 1, 1993; took oath of office on January 20, 1993; reelected on November 5, 1996.
