MAX BAUCUS, Democrat, of Helena, MT; born in Helena, December 11, 1941; graduated, Helena High School, 1959; B.A. in economics, Stanford University, 1964; LL.B., Stanford University Law School, 1967; attorney, Civil Aeronautics Board, 1967–71; attorney, George and Baucus law firm, Missoula, MT; married to the former Wanda Minge; one child, Zeno; member, Montana and District of Columbia bar associations; served in Montana House of Representatives, 1973–74; committees: chairman, Finance; Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry; Joint Committee on Taxation; ranking minority member, Environment and Public Works Committee; elected to the 94th Congress, November 5, 1974; reelected to the 95th Congress; elected to the U.S. Senate, November 7, 1978 for the six-year term beginning January 3, 1979; subsequently appointed on December 15, 1978, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Senator Paul Hatfield; reelected to each succeeding Senate term.
