BARBARA A. MIKULSKI, Democrat, of Baltimore, MD; born in Baltimore, July 20, 1936; education: B.A., Mount St. Agnes College, 1958; M.S.W., University of Maryland School of Social Work, 1965; former social worker for Catholic Charities and city of Baltimore; served as an adjunct professor, Department of Sociology, Loyola College; elected to the Baltimore City Council, 1971; Democratic nominee for the U.S. Senate in 1974, winning 43 percent of vote; elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in November, 1976; first woman appointed to the Energy and Commerce Committee; also served on the Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee; became the first woman representing the Democratic Party to be elected to a Senate seat not previously held by her husband, and the first Democratic woman ever to serve in both houses of Congress; Secretary, Democratic Conference; first woman to be elected to a leadership post; committees: Appropriations; Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions; Select Committee on Intelligence; elected to the U.S. Senate in November, 1986; reelected to each succeeding Senate term.

CARDIN, Democrat, of Baltimore, MD; born in Baltimore, October 5, 1943; education: graduated, City College High School, 1961; B.A., *cum laude*, University of Pittsburgh, 1964; L.L.B., 1st in class, University of Maryland School of Law, 1967; professional: attorney in the law firm of Rosen and Esterson, 1967-78; elected to Maryland House of Delegates in November 1966, serving from 1967-86; Speaker of the House of Delegates, 1979-86, the youngest Speaker at the time; elected to U.S. House of Representatives in November 1986, representing the 3rd Congressional District in Maryland, serving from 1987-2006; Senior Democratic Whip, 2003-06; Assistant Democrat Whip, 1987-2003; Commissioner, Commission for Security and Cooperation in Europe (CSCE), 1997-2006; Ranking Member, CSCE, 2003-06; co-chairman, CSCE, 2007; Vice President, Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe Parliamentary Assembly; member: Associated Jewish Charities and Welfare Fund, 1985-89; Trustee, St. Mary's College, 1988-99; Lifetime Member, NAACP, since 1990; Board of Visitors, University of Maryland Law School, 1991-2007; married: Myrna Edelman of Baltimore, 1964; two children, two grandchildren; committees: Budget; Environment and Public Works; Foreign Relations; Judiciary; Small Business and Entrepreneurship; elected to U.S. Senate on November 7, 2006.
