MIKE PENCE, Republican, of Columbus, IN; born in Columbus, June 7, 1959; education: Hanover College, 1981; J.D., Indiana University School of Law, 1986; professional: former Republican nominee for the U.S. House of Representatives, 2nd District, 1988 and 1990; president, Indiana Policy Review Foundation, 1991–93; radio broadcaster: the Mike Pence Show, syndicated statewide in Indiana; married: Karen; children: Michael, Charlotte, and Audrey; elected to the 107th Congress on November 7, 2000; reelected to the 108th through 112th Congress, 2011–13; Governor, State of Indiana, 2013–17; elected 48th Vice President of the United States on November 8, 2016; took the oath of office on January 20, 2017.
