The PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE.

SIR: I ask the Congress to consider amendments to the FY 1997 appropriations requests for the Department of Transportation that would provide additional resources to improve the safety of the air transportation of hazardous materials. The proposed increase in funding is fully offset by reductions to other Department of Transportation programs.

The details of these actions are set forth in the enclosed letter from the Acting Director of the Office of Management and Budget. I concur with his comments and observations.

Submitted for your consideration are amendments to your FY 1997 appropriations requests for the Department of Transportation. In total, these amendments would not increase the proposed budget totals.

As described in the enclosures, the proposed amendments would make the following changes to the pending FY 1997 requests in order to improve the safety of the air transportation of hazardous materials:

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Operations

- o Provide an additional \$10.5 million and 130 positions for FAA Operations. These additional resources would enable the FAA to increase hazardous materials inspections of air carriers, freight forwarders, freight consolidators, and repair stations.

Research and Special Programs Administration (RSPA)

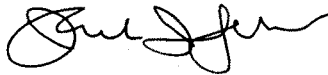
- o Provide an additional \$3.4 million and 18 positions for RSPA's Hazardous Materials Safety Program. These additional resources would complement the FAA initiative by: expanding RSPA's inspections of air hazardous materials shippers; expanding current hazardous materials research initiatives to focus on air transportation, reactive chemicals, and explosives; developing additional training materials focusing on air transportation; and increasing the dissemination of information to both air carriers and shippers. RSPA

would inspect shippers (i.e., those who originate the shipments of hazardous materials), while FAA would inspect all others. RSPA would increase its inspections of shippers of hazardous materials by air from about 500 to 1,500 per year.

The additional resources requested would be fully offset by reductions to the following Department of Transportation programs: FAA Facilities and Equipment; FAA Research, Engineering and Development; and the Federal-aid Highways Program.

I have carefully reviewed these proposals and am satisfied that they are necessary at this time. Therefore, I join Secretary Pena in recommending that the proposals be transmitted to Congress.

This amendment would increase the appropriations request for Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Operations by \$10.5 million and 130 positions for a Dangerous Goods Inspection Initiative. With these additional resources, the FAA will increase inspections of air carriers, freight forwarders, and repair stations to ensure that shipments of hazardous materials by air are transported properly. In addition, the FAA will increase outreach and dissemination of information to all of these groups in an effort to prevent hazardous materials accidents from occurring.

This proposal, and a related amendment for the Research and Special Programs Administration, would be fully offset by reductions to the pending requests for the FAA's Facilities and Equipment program and Research, Engineering and Development program, and the Federal-aid Highways program, as proposed in the accompanying budget amendments.

This amendment would increase the pending Research and Special Programs request by \$3.4 million and 18 positions for the Research and Special Programs Administration's (RSPA) hazardous materials safety program. These additional resources would complement the FAA's Dangerous Goods Inspection Initiative by expanding RSPA's inspections of air hazardous materials shippers. In addition, these resources would allow RSPA to expand hazardous materials research initiatives, develop additional training materials focusing on air transportation, and increase the dissemination of information to both air carriers and shippers.

This proposal, and a related amendment for the FAA's Operations program, would be fully offset by reductions to the pending requests for the FAA's Facilities and Equipment program and Research, Engineering and Development program, and the Federal-aid Highways program, as proposed in the accompanying budget amendments.
