Senator Kaine: "What you have is a grandstander, not a prosecutor."

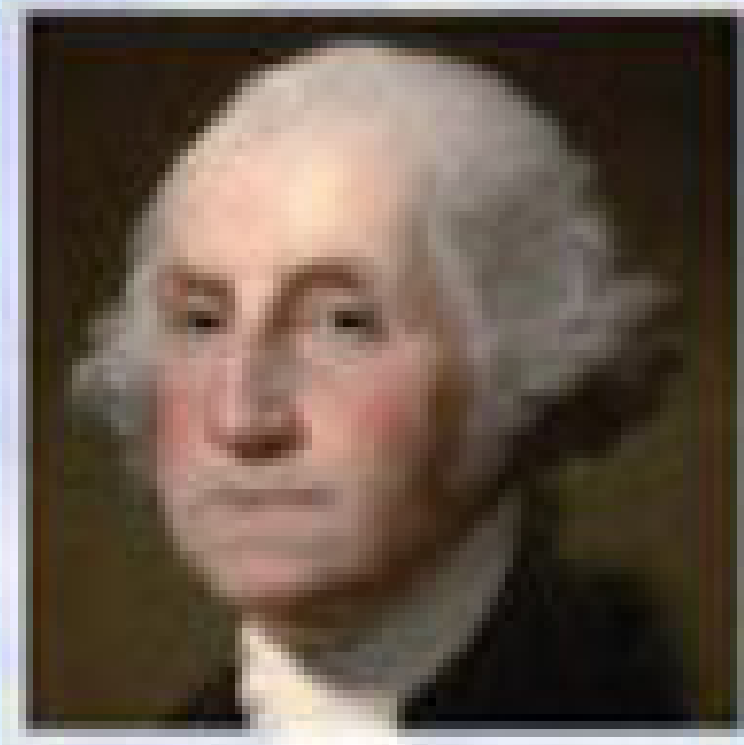
Senator Fetterman: "Just a smear and cheap shots."

Senator Schiff: "You don't disparage a witness ... Not if you're a professional, instead of a partisan."



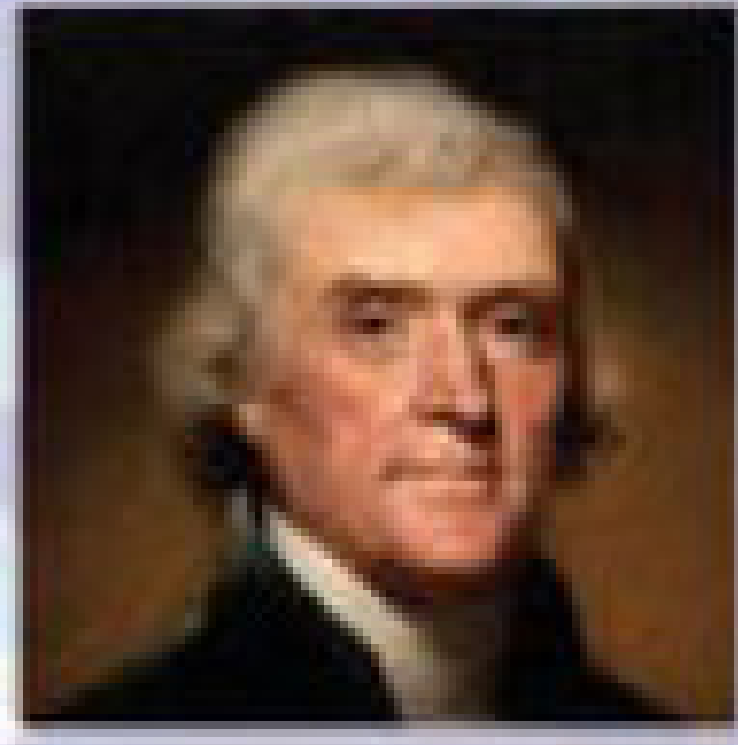
