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## PREFACE

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# GEORGIA—Continued

(6) The unmarried surviving spouse or minor children of any such disabled veteran as defined above shall also be entitled to an exemption of the greater of \$32,500.000 or the maximum which is granted to a disabled veteran under Section 802 of the United States Code as amended on the homestead so long as the unmarried surviving spouse or minor children continue actually to occupy the home as a residence and homestead.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Section 801 of the Code applies to specially adapted housing for disabled veterans.</p> <p>Sales Tax Exemptions on a vehicle purchased by a service connected disabled veteran with a grant from the Department of Veterans Affairs because of a service connected loss, or permanent loss of use of one or both hands or feet, or permanent impairment of vision of both eyes to a prescribed degree.</p>	(Section)

Exemption from all ad valorem taxes may be granted to a service connected disabled wartime veteran who is a citizen and resident of Georgia and who was discharged under honorable conditions and who has been adjudicated by the Department of Veterans Affairs as being 100% totally and permanently disabled and entitled to receive service connected benefits and any veteran who is receiving or who is entitled to receive a statutory award from the Department of Veterans Affairs for loss or permanent loss of use of one or both feet; loss of permanent loss of use of one or both hands; loss of sight in one or both eyes; permanent impairment of vision of both eyes. This exemption will be granted on the vehicle that the veteran owns and on which he actually places free Handicapped Veterans (HV) motor vehicle license plates he receives from the State of Georgia.

Military personnel who serve on active duty as a member of the Armed Forces of the United States in combat activities, during a period designated by the President of the United States and are hospitalized as a result of an injury or confined as a prisoner of the opposing forces of the United States, may claim exclusion of Georgia Income Taxes for the period of service in the combat zone, plus the period of continuous hospitalization attributable to the injury, plus the period of confinement and the next 180 days thereafter.

Military personnel who die as a result of wounds, disease, or injury incurred while serving as a member of the Armed Forces of the United States in a combat zone, during a period designated by the President of the United States, shall be exempt of all income taxes imposed by the laws of Georgia for the taxable year of his or her death, nor shall such taxes apply with respect to any prior taxable year ending on or after the first day he served in combat zone after June 24, 1960.

Cigars and cigarettes purchased exclusively for use by patients at the Georgia War Veterans Home, Milledgeville, Georgia, and the Georgia War Veterans Nursing Home, Augusta, Georgia, are exempt from Georgia Cigar and Cigarette excise tax.

## VL. OTHER AREAS

### A. Code of Federated States of Micronesia

This 2 Vol. 1987 Code restricts land ownership to citizens of the Trust Territories, I Code Fed. St. Micro. Ch. I Sec. 113 (and Art. XIII Sec. 4 of the FSM Constitution), and excludes active military persons' wages/salaries from FSM income taxes, II Code Fed. St. Micro. Title 54 Sec. 112(6), (11). No mention is made of veterans in the Code.

#### 1. STATE OF YAP (Part of Federated States of Micronesia)

1 Yap State Code Sec. 806 recognizes Veteran's Day. 25 Yap State Code Sec. 302 exempts persons in the military service of the U.S. from motor vehicle operator's licenses. No other provisions relate to veterans in the 1987 Code (1 vol.).

#### 2. STATE OF TRUK (Now called Chuuk), Part of FSM

Real Estate mortgage Law, TSL 4-91, Act 1-138 (1981) Sec. 28, only gives mortgagees a lien and not any ownership interest as a non-citizen of Truk. Act No. 3-53 (1988) Sec. 4(a) recognizes the U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs as a deed of trust beneficiary only, not as an owner-citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia land, Sec. 21. The Truk Constitution also limits ownership of land by non-citizens. No mention of veterans is made in Truk law.

### B. REPUBLIC OF PALAU (Belau)

The 2 Vol. Republic National Code does not refer to veterans. Title 38 Ch. 3 Sec. 301 and the Belau Constitution, Art. XIII Sec. 8 restrict land ownership to citizens of Palau. Title 42 Ch. 4 Sec. 402 exempts persons in the military service from motor vehicle operator's licenses (1986).

C. The Marshall Islands Revised Code does provide for guardianships, II M.I. Rev. Code Title 25 Ch. 2 Sec. 1-15; recognize memorial day, I. M.I. Rev. Code Ch. 9 Title I Sec. 1 (on March 1 each year); exempt active military persons from operator's license requirements for motor vehicle, I. M.I. Rev. Code Title 13 Ch. 1 Part III Sec. 12(1); and, restrict land ownership to citizens of the M.I. only, II M.I. Rev. Code Title 24 Part II Sec. 13.
