PREFACE

During the course of its study, the Commission on Administrative Review held three major series of hearings and meetings on a wide variety of subjects. The transcripts of all official hearings and meetings have been published, and in order to make this material more accessible to future users, the Commission has indexed the following volumes: *Congressional, Media, and People Who Work the Hill Panels; Business Meeting* (November 30; December 1, 1976); *Financial Ethics* (January 13, 14; February 2, 7, 1977); and *Administrative Reorganization and Legislative Management* (June 1, 2; August 2, 3; September 8, 1977). The transcript of the initial meeting of the Commission (*Organizational Meeting of the Commission on Administrative Review*, September 17, 1976), in which the rules, outline of study, staffing plans, and workplan of the Commission were discussed and adopted, has also been published. However, as this is a very brief document, it has not been indexed.

In addition to the published hearings and meetings, the Commission has produced a variety of reports and committee prints. Because these documents have substantial contents listings and are readily usable, indices have not been prepared for them.

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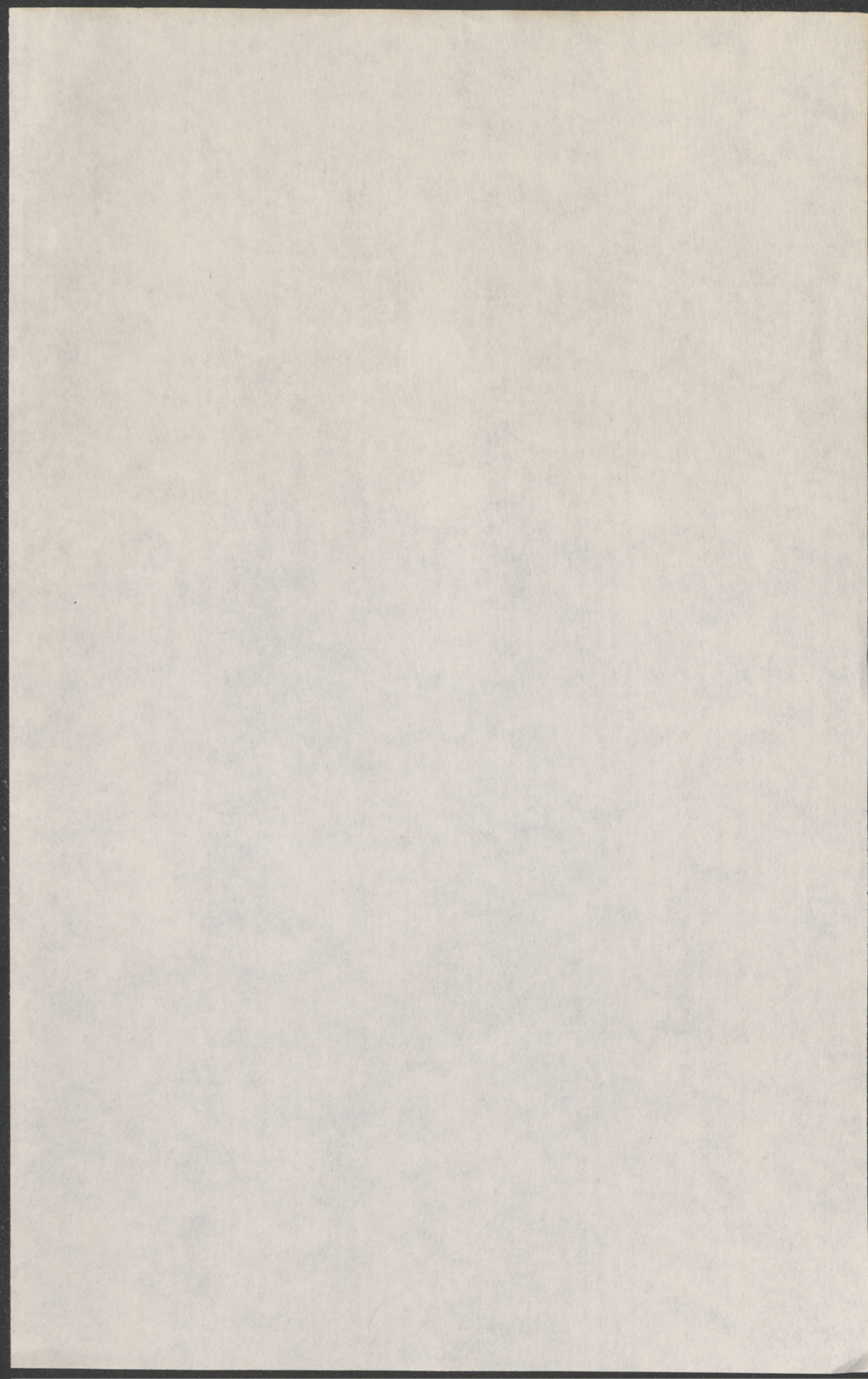
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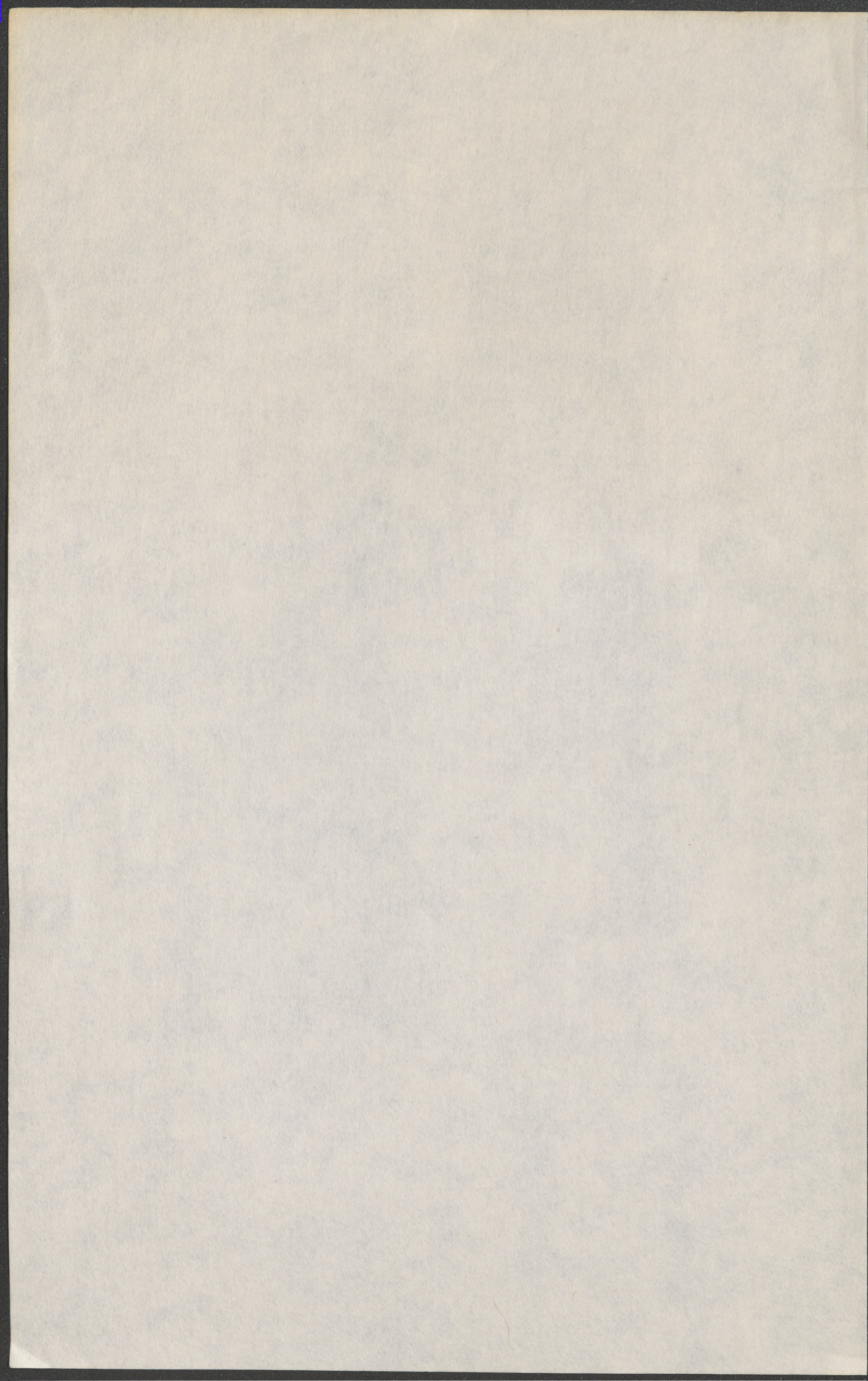
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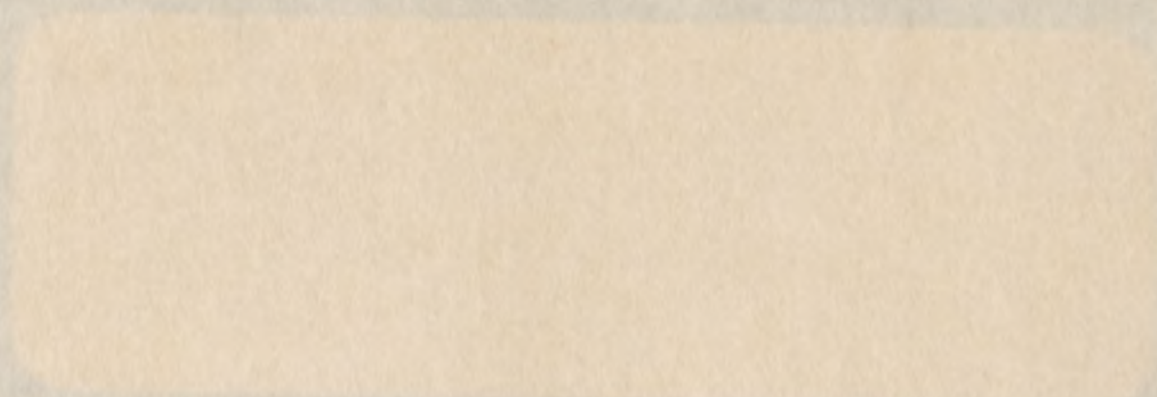
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
