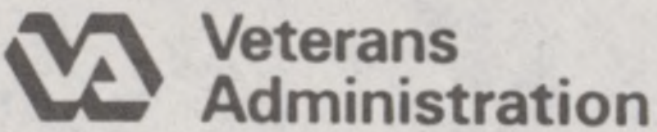

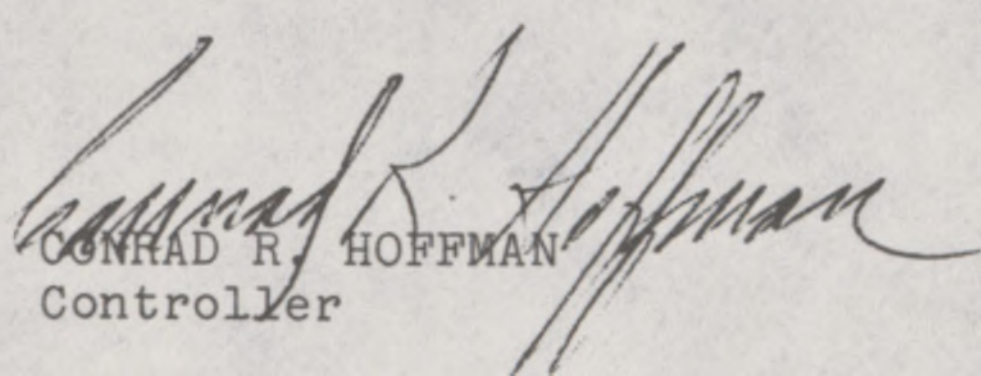

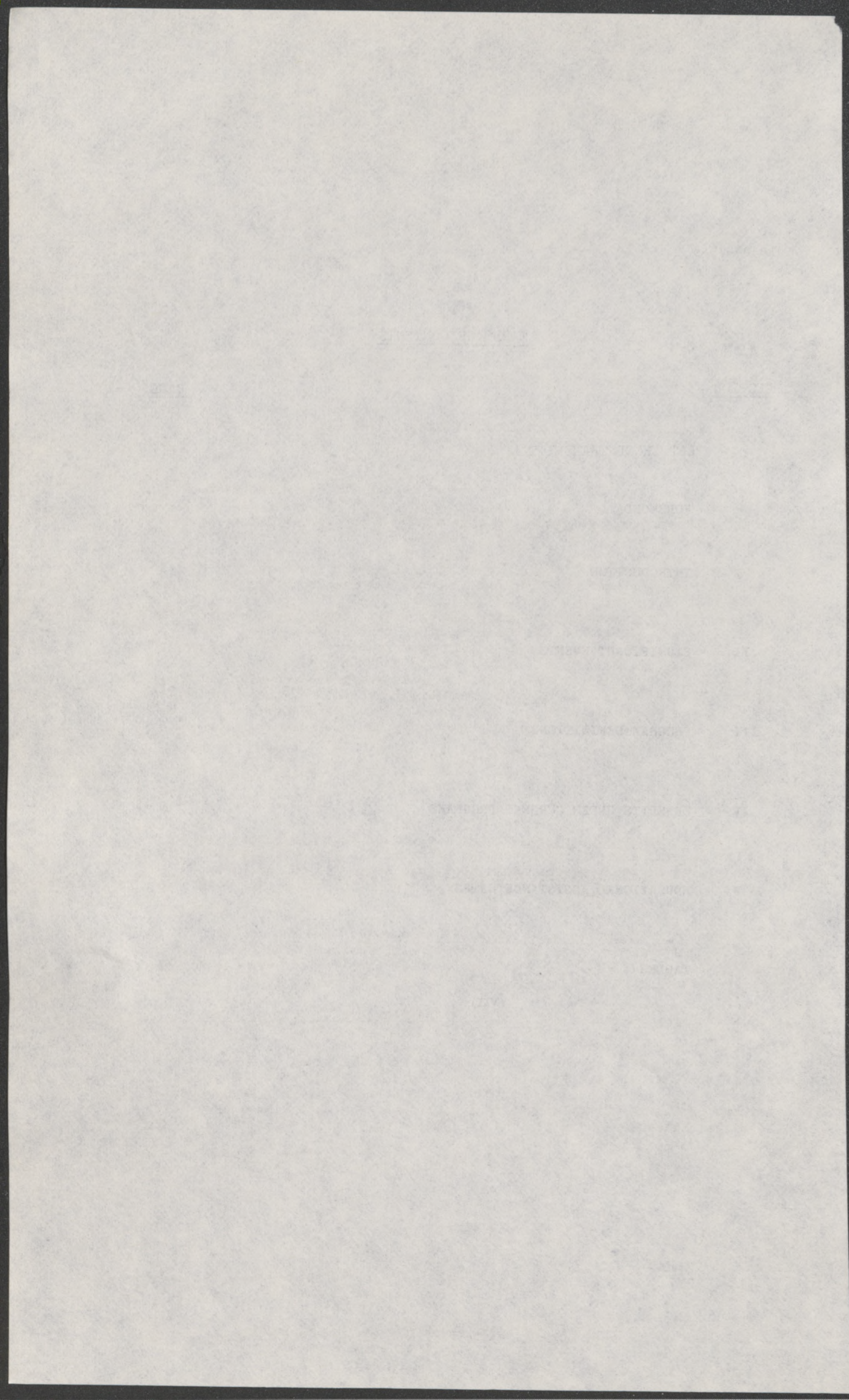

I. INTRODUCTION

This bulletin presents data related to the usage of VA education and training benefits by veterans, service personnel, and the survivors and dependents of deceased or totally disabled veterans. In previous bulletins, textual discussions of relevant data items were presented; but with the April 1979 Information Bulletin, a simpler format is adopted which excludes the textual discussions. The new format represents a more concise profile of current educational assistance programs.

During the first 10 years of the current GI bill, the numbers of persons in training reached its fall peak in November and its spring peak in April. In fact for each successive peak month through November 1975 trainee counts increased. With the imminence of the May 31, 1976, 10-year delimiting date, the April 1976 in-training count reversed this trend. Now, with fewer veterans eligible to train, the trend has been for each peak month to exhibit a smaller number of persons in training than reported for the previous fall or spring peak months. Concomitant with this reversal April is no longer the peak month for Spring enrollments: at the end of March 1978 there were 935,000 persons in training under chapter 34. This figure exceeded the April 1978 count by 18,500 trainees; at the end of February 1979 there were 740,700 persons in training under chapter 34, and this figure exceeded the April 1979 count by 3,800 trainees. However, since almost all of the data used in the regular preparation of the Information Bulletin are available only for the months of April and November, data for this bulletin are based on the number of persons in training at the end of April 1979.

Scope of Information

GI bill trainees (Chapter 34): At the end of April 1979 there were 817,000 persons in training under the three educational assistance programs administered by the Veterans Administration. Some 737,000 of these trainees were veterans and active duty service personnel using entitlement under the GI bill (see table 3).

Dependent's Educational Assistance (Chapter 35): A much smaller part of the 817,000 total trainees is the 64,000 eligible dependents (see definition in Section III. A brief statement of eligibility for training under this program is presented in Section IV.

Vocational Rehabilitation and other training by disabled veterans (Chapter 31): There were 17,000 disabled veterans who were receiving training under the Vocational Rehabilitation program at the end of April 1979; however, when we consider all of the training taken by disabled veterans, this is only the "tip of the iceberg." For example, the 18,000 chapter 31 trainees reported at the end of November 1977 represent only 22 percent of all the disabled veterans in training at that time under VA auspices; there were an additional 63,000 using GI bill benefits.

Program Groups: "GI bill" is a term used to identify a series of legislative enactments which have provided readjustment benefits -- particularly educational benefits -- for veterans of World War II, the Korean conflict and for those veterans and service personnel eligible under chapter 34, title 38, of the U.S. Code. Educational benefits available under the current GI bill (ch. 34) are briefly described in Section IV, along with descriptions of Vocational Rehabilitation benefits (ch. 31) and the Dependents' Educational Assistance Program (ch. 35). Table 3 lists various statistics related to persons in training at the end of April 1979 and other pertinent times. These data are partitioned by program entitlement and type of training.

Source and Reliability of Data: The training data for chapters 34 and 35 presented in this publication are based on the tabulation of 100 percent of the records in the education master record file as of the last processing cycle in April 1979. Chapter 31 data are based on the tabulation of 100 percent of the Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) master record file as of the end of April 1979.

II. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Delimiting Date - August 31, 1977: As of August 31, 1977 those individuals who had separated from active duty 10 or more years prior to this date were no longer eligible for flight, farm or on-job training. From this date on eligibility will be delimited for all GI bill training by the veteran's 10th anniversary of separation from active duty. [NOTE: This was modified by the passage of Public Law 95-202 which allows veterans who had mental or physical disabilities which interfered with their training and had passed their delimiting date to enter or reenter training providing their entitlement was not otherwise exhausted. The effective date of this law is May 31, 1976. The legislation was signed into law November 23, 1977 (fiscal year 1978).]

III. PROGRAM DEFINITIONS: Terms used in this bulletin to identify groups of beneficiaries are defined as follows:

Veterans and Service Personnel: Throughout this bulletin the term "eligible veteran" refers to any civilian as of April 1979 whose active military service exceeds 180 days and whose discharge or release from such service was under conditions other than dishonorable and who otherwise meets the eligibility criteria for VA educational assistance as prescribed by law. The term "service personnel" refers to military personnel on active duty as of April 1979 and in a first or continuous enlistment which exceeds 180 days, and is meant to include certain veterans reenlisted and on active duty as of that date, and who otherwise meet the eligibility criteria for VA educational assistance as prescribed by law.

Post-Korean Conflict: Refers to veterans who served after January 31, 1955, including those who served during the Vietnam era through December 31, 1976.

Peacetime Post-Korean Conflict: Refers to those veterans who served after January 31, 1955, but not after August 4, 1964.

Vietnam Era: Refers to veterans and service personnel who served on or after August 5, 1964. While the Vietnam era was ended by Presidential Proclamation as of May 7, 1975, the proclamation did not affect entitlement to chapter 34 benefits for those in service on May 7, 1975, or for those who entered active duty service subsequent to that date. Similarly, the proclamation in no way affects chapter 31 or chapter 35 entitlement.

Post-Vietnam Era: This refers to all persons with service beginning on or after January 1, 1977. [NOTE that this is a change in the definitions given in some previous Information Bulletins.] While the Vietnam era was ended by proclamation of the President on May 7, 1975, all persons who entered service subsequent to that date continued to have the same eligibility for educational benefits as any other post-Korean conflict veteran. With the passage of Public Law 94-502, eligibility criteria changed for persons who entered on active duty after December 31, 1976 (with a few exceptions). The wording of the introduction to this legislation defines this group of service personnel and veterans as "Post-Vietnam Era"; therefore, with this enactment we are adopting the new definition.

Eligible Children: Refers to the sons and daughters of veterans who died of service-connected causes or whose service-connected disability is rated permanent and total, or who died while a disability so evaluated was in existence, and, also, to sons and daughters of service personnel who are missing in action or prisoners of war for more than 90 days.

Eligible Spouses: Refers to spouses of living veterans whose service-connected disability is rated permanent and total as well as to surviving spouses of veterans who died while a disability so evaluated was in existence, or of service-connected causes and, also, to the spouses of service personnel who are missing in action or prisoners of war for more than 90 days.

Veterans Eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation: Refers to veterans with a compensable service-connected disability who are found to be in need of special rehabilitation benefits to overcome the vocational handicap imposed by their disabilities.

IV. BENEFITS UNDER CURRENT PROGRAMS

The Current GI Bill (ch. 34) became effective June 1, 1966. It was enacted by the Congress to provide educational or vocational opportunities to veterans whose education plans may have been impeded by service in the Armed Forces after January 31, 1955. Also, these opportunities were made available to service personnel on active duty who had completed 181 or more days of service. Persons who complete 18 or more months of active duty in the Armed Forces are eligible for up to the equivalent of 45 months of full-time schooling or on-job training.

The Vocational Rehabilitation Program (ch. 31) is for veterans who are in need of vocational rehabilitation to overcome a handicap resulting from service-connected disability. They may receive up to 48 months of education or training to restore their employability "unless a longer period is prescribed by the (VA) Administrator." The full cost of their training is paid by the Veterans Administration and, in addition, they receive a subsistence allowance while in training and for two months after rehabilitation. These disabled veterans are provided counseling assistance in selecting a suitable objective and planning a program of rehabilitation training. While in training they are provided continuing help by vocational rehabilitation specialists. Necessary employment assistance is provided following completion of training.

The Dependents' and Survivors' Educational Assistance Program (ch. 35) serves survivors or dependents of those veterans who died from service-connected causes or whose service-connected disability is rated permanent and total, or who died while a disability so evaluated was in existence. Spouses and children of service personnel who are missing in action or interned by a hostile foreign government for more than 90 days, are also eligible under this program. Up to 45 months of full-time training is provided in approved schools and on-job training programs.

The Post-Vietnam Era Veterans' Educational Assistance Program (ch. 32) was enacted to provide educational assistance to those persons who enter the Armed Forces after December 31, 1976, to assist young men and women in obtaining an education they might not otherwise be able to afford, and to promote and assist the all volunteer military program of the United States by attracting qualified persons to serve in the Armed Forces. To be eligible for training under this program the person must have served 181 days or more, have been released under conditions other than dishonorable and have participated in a payroll deduction plan whereby the participant sets aside from \$50 to \$75 a month to a maximum of \$2,700 which the VA will match on a 2 to 1 basis when the person elects to enter training.

V. EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE RATES

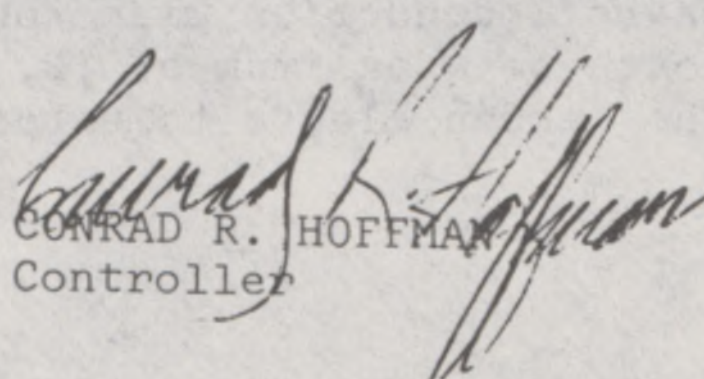
FLIGHT TRAINING - 90 percent of established charges. One month eligibility for each \$130 to January 31, 1970; 1 month eligibility for each \$175 from February 1, 1970; 1 month eligibility for each \$220 from September 1, 1972; 1 month eligibility for each \$260 from September 1, 1974; and 1 month eligibility for each \$270 from January 1, 1975. [This has been increased to \$288 as of October 1, 1977 (fiscal year 1978).]

CORRESPONDENCE TRAINING - 100 percent of established charges for contracts made prior to January 1, 1973; 90 percent for contracts made on or after January 1, 1973. For contracts made before January 1, 1973; one month eligibility for each \$100 to September 30, 1967; 1 month for each \$130 to January 31, 1970; 1 month for each \$175 from February 1, 1970. For contracts made on or after January 1, 1973; 1 month eligibility for each \$220 to August 31, 1974; 1 month for each \$260 from September 1, 1974; 1 month for each \$270 from January 1, 1975; and 1 month for each \$292 from October 1, 1976. [This has been increased to \$311 as of October 1, 1977 (fiscal year 1978).]

THREE-QUARTER AND HALF-TIME TRAINING rates proportional to full time. Tuition and fees paid on less than half-time training.

ON-JOB TRAINING - Rates reduced after each 6-month period of training, through the 18th month; no further reductions.

SERVICE PERSONNEL - Same as veterans for correspondence or flight training; the cost of tuition and fees for other types of training not to exceed \$311 per month for a full-time program.

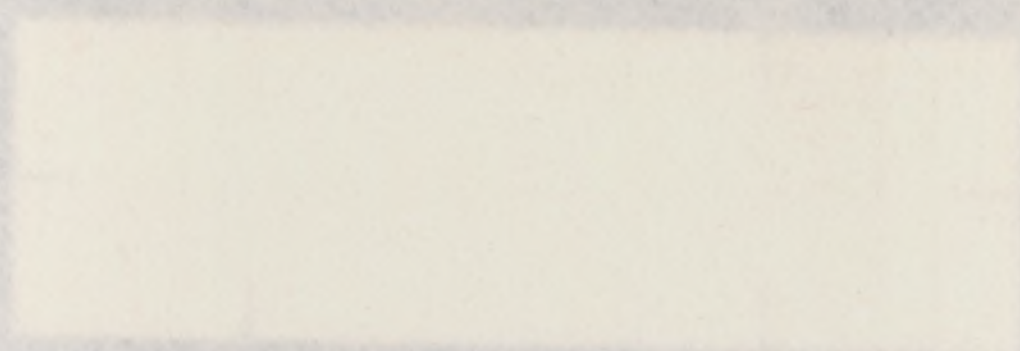
