Community Reinvestment Act Regulations—Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that notwithstanding the provisions of the Congressional Review Act, H.J. Res. 90, providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency relating to “Community Reinvestment Act Regulations”, remain in status quo through Oct 19, 2020. **Page S6039**

Authorizing Leadership To Make Appointments—Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that, notwithstanding the adjournment of the Senate, the President of the Senate, the President Pro Tempore, and the Majority and Minority Leaders be authorized to make appointments to commissions, committees, boards, conferences, or interparliamentary conferences authorized by law, by concurrent action of the two Houses, or by order of the Senate. **Page S6039**

Pro Forma Sessions—Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that the Senate adjourn, to then convene for pro forma sessions only, with no business being conducted on the following dates and times, and that following each pro forma session, the Senate adjourn until the next pro forma session: Tuesday, October 6, 2020, at 11:30 a.m.; Friday, October 9, 2020, at 10 a.m.; Tuesday, October 13, 2020, at 8:45 a.m.; Friday, October 16, 2020, at 4:30 p.m.; and that when the Senate adjourns on Friday, October 16, 2020, it next convene at 4:30 p.m., on Monday, October 19, 2020. **Page S6039**

Nominations Cloture—Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that the motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Aileen Mercedes Cannon, of Florida, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Florida, Toby Crouse, of Kansas, to be United States District Judge for the District of Kansas, J. Philip Calabrese, of Ohio, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Ohio, James Ray Knepp II, of Ohio, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Ohio, and Michael Jay Newman, of Ohio, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Ohio, filed on Wednesday, September 30, 2020, be withdrawn. **Page S6039**

S. 2193, to require the Administrator of General Services to issue guidance to clarify that Federal agencies may pay by charge card for the charging of Federal electric motor vehicles. Signed on October 1, 2020. (Public Law 116–160)

S. 3105, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 456 North Meridian Street in Indianapolis, Indiana, as the “Richard G. Lugar Post Office”. Signed on October 1, 2020. (Public Law 116–161)
