Suspensions—Proceedings Resumed: The House agreed to suspend the rules and pass the following measures. Consideration began Wednesday, January 10th.

China Exchange Rate Transparency Act of 2023: H.R. 839, amended, to require the United States Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund to advocate for increased transparency with respect to exchange rate policies of the People's

Republic of China, by a 2/3 yeas-and-nays vote of 379 yeas to 1 nay, Roll No. 9; **Page H124**

Taiwan Non-Discrimination Act of 2023: H.R. 540, amended, to require the Secretary of the Treasury to pursue more equitable treatment of Taiwan at the international financial institutions; **Page H125**

Pressure Regulatory Organizations To End Chinese Threats to Taiwan Act: H.R. 803, amended, to direct certain financial regulators to exclude representatives of the Peoples Republic of China from certain banking organizations upon notice of certain threats or danger; and **Page H125**

OFAC Licensure for Investigators Act: H.R. 6370, amended, to require the Office of Foreign Assets Control to develop a program under which private sector firms may receive a license to conduct nominal financial transactions in furtherance of the firms' investigations. **Page H126**

Providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the National Labor Relations Board relating to "Standard for Determining Joint Employer Status": The House passed H.J. Res. 98, providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the National Labor Relations Board relating to "Standard for Determining Joint Employer Status", by a yeas-and-nays vote of 206 yeas to 177 nays, Roll No. 10. **Pages H112–124, H124–125**

H. Res. 947, the rule providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 788) and the joint resolutions (H.J. Res. 98) and (S.J. Res. 38) was agreed to yesterday, January 11th.

No Russian Agriculture Act: H.R. 4768, amended, to require the Secretary of the Treasury to instruct the United States Executive Directors at the international financial institutions to advocate for investment in projects that decrease reliance on Russia for agricultural commodities. **Page H125**
