Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows:

Supplemental report on H.R. 529, to extend the customs waters of the United States from 12 nautical miles to 24 nautical miles from the baselines of the United States, consistent with Presidential Proclamation 7219 (H. Rept. 118–436, Part 2);

H.R. 6233, to amend the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977 to authorize partnerships between States and nongovernmental entities for the purpose of reclaiming and restoring land and water resources adversely affected by coal mining activities before August 3, 1977, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–438);

H.R. 4389, to amend the Neotropical Migratory Bird Conservation Act to make improvements to that Act, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–439);

H.R. 6443, to take certain land in the State of California into trust for the benefit of the Jamul Indian Village of California Tribe, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–440);

H.R. 6492, to improve recreation opportunities on, and facilitate greater access to, Federal public land, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–441, Part 1);

H.R. 661, to require U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to take into custody certain aliens

who have been charged in the United States with a crime that resulted in the death or serious bodily injury of another person, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–442);

H.R. 3446, to impose certain limitations on consent decrees and settlement agreements by agencies that require the agencies to take regulatory action in accordance with the terms thereof, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–443);

H.R. 6655, to amend and reauthorize the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–444, Part 1);

H.J. Res. 116, providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of the Labor relating to “Employee or Independent Contractor Classification Under the Fair Labor Standards Act” (H. Rept. 118–445);

H.R. 1797, to require the Consumer Product Safety Commission to promulgate a consumer product safety standard with respect to rechargeable lithium-ion batteries used in micromobility devices, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–446);

H.R. 2964, to require the Federal Trade Commission to issue regulations requiring certain products to have “Do Not Flush” labeling, and for other purposes, with amendments (H. Rept. 118–447); and

H.R. 5202, to reauthorize the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–448).
