Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows: H.R. 7683, to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require institutions of higher education to adopt and adhere to principles of free speech, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–468);

H.R. 5333, to amend the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 to exclude from the limit on leverage certain amounts invested in smaller enterprises located in rural or low-income areas and small businesses in critical technology areas, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–469);

H.R. 7985, to require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to submit to Congress a report on the entrepreneurial challenges facing entrepreneurs with a disability, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–470);

H.R. 6571, to establish a critical supply chain resiliency and crisis response program in the Department of Commerce, and to secure American leadership in deploying emerging technologies, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–473).
