During consideration of this nomination today, Senate also took the following action:

By 67 yeas to 23 nays (Vote No. EX. 18), Senate agreed to the motion to close further debate on the nomination. **Page S381**

A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that at approximately 12 noon, on Monday, January 27, 2025, Senate resume consideration of the nomination, post-cloture. **Page S381**

**Nomination Confirmed:** Senate confirmed the following nomination:

By 59 yeas to 34 nays (Vote No. EX. 17), Kristi Noem, of South Dakota, to be Secretary of Homeland Security. **Pages S375–80**

**Record Votes:** Two record votes were taken today. (Total—18) **Pages S380, S381**

**Adjournment:** Senate convened at 9:30 a.m. and adjourned at 12:38 p.m., until 12 noon on Monday, January 27, 2025. (For Senate’s program, see the remarks of the Majority Leader in today’s Record on page S381.)
