Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows:

H.R. 4491, to require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to implement certain recommendations relating to information technology modernization, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 119–223);

H.R. 3174, to increase loan limits for loans made to small manufacturers, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–224);

H.R. 4549, to amend the Small Business Act to clarify the responsibilities of the Office of Rural Affairs of the Small Business Administration, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 119–225);

H.R. 4495, to extend the statute of limitations for fraud under certain pandemic programs, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 119–226);

H.R. 2066, to amend the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 to exclude from the limit on leverage certain amounts invested in smaller enterprises located in rural or low-income areas and small businesses in critical technology areas, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–227);

H.R. 980, to amend title 38, United States Code, to make certain improvements to the provision of on-campus educational and vocational counseling by

the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–228);

H.R. 1569, to establish a pilot program to assess the use of technology to speed up and enhance the cargo inspection process at land ports of entry along the border (H. Rept. 119–229); and

H.R. 2659, to ensure the security and integrity of United States critical infrastructure by establishing an interagency task force and requiring a comprehensive report on the targeting of United States critical infrastructure by People's Republic of China state-sponsored cyber actors, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 119–230). **Page H3697**
