Measures Introduced: One bill was introduced, as follows: S. 3168. Page S8111

Measures Passed:

Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act: Senate passed S. 2392, to increase, effective as of December 1, 2025, the rates of compensation for veterans with service-connected disabilities and the rates of dependency and indemnity compensation for the survivors of certain disabled veterans. Pages S8035–36

Lactation Spaces for Veteran Moms Act: Senate passed S. 778, to amend title 38, United States Code, to require a lactation space in each medical center of the Department of Veterans Affairs, after agreeing to the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute. Page S8036

250th Anniversary of the United States Marine Corps: Committee on Armed Services was discharged from further consideration of S. Res. 124, recognizing the 250th anniversary of the United States Marine Corps, and the resolution was then agreed to, after agreeing to the following amendment proposed thereto: Pages S8036–38

Blumenthal Amendment No. 3936, to include the liberation of Helmand Province in the list of historic battles where United States Marines served. Page S8038

Measures Considered:

Continuing Appropriations and Extensions Act—Agreement: Senate continued consideration of the motion to proceed to consideration of H.R. 5371, making continuing appropriations and extensions for fiscal year 2026. Pages S8033–35, S8036, S8038–43

By 60 yeas to 40 nays (Vote No. 610), three-fifths of those Senators duly chosen and sworn, having voted in the affirmative, Senate upon reconsideration agreed to the motion to close further debate on the motion to proceed to consideration of the bill. Page S8043
