H.R. 4930, to expand the sharing of information with respect to suspected violations of intellectual property rights in trade, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–415);

H.R. 6500, to extend duty-free treatment provided with respect to imports from certain countries in Africa under the African Growth and Opportunity Act, to extend customs user fees, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–416);

H.R. 4593, to amend the Energy Policy and Conservation Act to revise the definition of showerhead (H. Rept. 119–417);

H.R. 6504, to extend duty-free treatment provided with respect to imports from Haiti under the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–418);

H.R. 5184, to prohibit the Secretary of Energy from enforcing energy efficiency standards applicable to manufactured housing, and for other purposes, with amendments (H. Rept. 119–419);

H.R. 2988, to amend the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 to specify requirements concerning the consideration of pecuniary and non-pecuniary factors, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–421);

H.R. 4366, to clarify the treatment of 2 or more employers as joint employers under the National Labor Relations Act and the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–422); and

H.R. 2262, to amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to exclude certain activities from hours worked, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–423).
