## R E P O R T

[To accompany H. Res 996]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 996, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

### SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H. Res. 994, expressing the sense of the House of Representatives on the fifth anniversary of the terrorist attacks launched against the United States on September 11, 2001, under a closed rule. The rule provides four hours of debate in the House equally divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and Minority Leader or their designees. The rule waives all points of order against consideration of the resolution. The rule provides one motion to recommit which may not contain instructions.

Finally, the rule provides that notwithstanding the operation of the previous question, the Chair may postpone further consideration of the resolution to a time designated by the Speaker.

### EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

The Rules Committee is not aware of any points of order against consideration of the resolution. The waiver of all points of order against consideration of the resolution is prophylactic in nature.
