

PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (H.R. 7)
TO PROHIBIT TAXPAYER FUNDED ABORTIONS

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 42, by a record vote of 7 to 1, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 7, the No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion and Abortion Insurance Full Disclosure Act of 2015, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader or their respective designees. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the bill shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill. The resolution provides one motion to recommit.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

The waiver of all points of order against consideration of the bill includes a waiver of the following:

- Clause 9 of rule XXI, which requires a list of all earmarks, limited tax benefits, or limited tariff benefits contained in the measure, or a certification that the measure does not contain any of those items. It is important to note that the Committees on Energy and Commerce, Ways and Means, and the Judiciary intend to file the required earmark statements tomorrow, prior to floor consideration of the bill; and
- Clause 11 of rule XXI, prohibiting the consideration of a bill or joint resolution which has not been reported by a committee until the third calendar day on which such measure has

been available to Members, Delegates, and the Resident Commissioner.

Although the resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, the Committee is not aware of any points of order. The waiver is prophylactic in nature.
