In accordance with Rule 18(e)(2) of the Committee on Ethics (Committee), the Committee hereby submits the following Report to the House of Representatives:

I. FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

On July 28, 2021, the Committee convened for the purpose of considering the July 22, 2021, arrest of Representative Hank Johnson, for Crowding, Obstructing, or Incommoding, during a protest outside a Senate Office Building in Washington, D.C. Representative Johnson was released following his arrest. Representative Johnson informed the Committee he paid a \$50 fine prior to his release. The legal proceedings related to his arrest are expected to be resolved with no further action.

The Committee voted against impanelling an investigative subcommittee in this matter. The Committee considered the scope and nature of the conduct described above and determined that review by an investigative subcommittee is not required in this matter.

The Committee has determined to take no further action in this matter, and upon publication of this Report, considers the matter closed.

The Committee made no special oversight findings in this Report. No budget statement is submitted. No funding is authorized by any measure in this Report.
