## R E P O R T

[To accompany H. Res. 922]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 922, by a record vote of 8 to 4, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

### SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 1147, the Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Act of 2023, under a structured rule. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Education and the Workforce or their respective designees. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Education and the Workforce now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution makes in order only those amendments printed in the report. Each amendment shall be considered only in the order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the question. All points of order against the amendments printed in the report are waived. The resolution provides one motion to recommit. The resolution further provides for consideration of H.R.

357, the Ensuring Accountability in Agency Rulemaking Act, under a closed rule. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted, and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their respective designees. The resolution provides one motion to recommit. The resolution further provides that on any legislative day of the second session of the One Hundred Eighteenth Congress before January 9, 2024, the Speaker may dispense with organizational and legislative business and that the Journal of the proceedings of the previous day shall be considered as approved if applicable.

SUMMARY OF THE AMENDMENTS TO H.R. 1147 MADE IN ORDER

1. Luna (FL): Ensures that the whole milk served in schools can be organic or non-organic. (10 minutes)
2. Mills (FL): Prohibits schools participating in the school lunch program from purchasing or offering milk produced by China state-owned enterprises. (10 minutes)
3. Tiffany (WI), Vasquez (NM): Prevents the USDA from issuing any rule that bans varieties of milk covered in this bill, including chocolate milk. (10 minutes)

TEXT OF AMENDMENTS TO H.R. 1147 MADE IN ORDER

1. AN AMENDMENT TO BE OFFERED BY REPRESENTATIVE LUNA OF FLORIDA OR HER DESIGNEE, DEBATABLE FOR 10 MINUTES

Page 3, line 6, insert “**ORGANIC OR NON-ORGANIC**” before “**WHOLE MILK**”.

Page 3, line 17, insert “organic or non-organic” after “unflavored”.

2. AN AMENDMENT TO BE OFFERED BY REPRESENTATIVE MILLS OF FLORIDA OR HIS DESIGNEE, DEBATABLE FOR 10 MINUTES

Page 4, line 10, strike the period and quotation mark at the end and insert the following:

“(E) PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN PURCHASES.—The Secretary shall prohibit schools participating in the school lunch program under this Act from purchasing or offering milk produced by China state-owned enterprises.”.

3. AN AMENDMENT TO BE OFFERED BY REPRESENTATIVE TIFFANY OF WISCONSIN OR HIS DESIGNEE, DEBATABLE FOR 10 MINUTES

Page 4, line 10, strike the period and quotation mark at the end and insert the following:

“(E) LIMITATION ON AUTHORITY.—The Secretary may not prohibit any school participating in the school lunch pro-

gram under this Act from offering students the milk described in subparagraph (A)(ii).”
