The Base Closure Community Development and Homeless Assistance Act of 1994 (October 25, 1994), as amended by Pub. L. 104–106, February 10, 1996, created the Base Reuse Program to expand the supply of homeless assistance resources at base closure and realignment sites. Interim rules implementing the Act were published by both the Department of Defense (DoD) and HUD on August 8, 1995 and August 17, 1995 respectively and both Agencies published final rules on July 1, 1997 and July 11, 1997 respectively.
