hereby given that, in a letter dated
October 19, 1998, the President declared
a major disaster under the authority ofthe Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief
and Emergency Assistance Act (42
U.S.C. 5121 *et seq.*), as follows:I have determined that the damage in
certain areas of the State of Missouri,
resulting from severe storms and flooding on
July 10-31, 1998, is of sufficient severity and
magnitude to warrant a major disaster
declaration under the Robert T. Stafford
Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance
Act, Pub. L. 93-288, as amended ("the
Stafford Act").I, therefore, declare that such a major
disaster exists in the State of Missouri.In order to provide Federal assistance, you
are hereby authorized to allocate from funds
available for these purposes, such amounts as
you find necessary for Federal disaster
assistance and administrative expenses.You are authorized to provide Individual
Assistance and Hazard Mitigation in the
designated areas and any other forms of
assistance under the Stafford Act you may
deem appropriate. Consistent with the
requirement that Federal assistance be
supplemental, any Federal funds provided
under the Stafford Act for Hazard Mitigation
will be limited to 75 percent of the total
eligible costs. If at a later date Public
Assistance is warranted, Federal funds
provided under that program will also be
limited to 75 percent of the total eligible
costs.The time period prescribed for the
implementation of section 310(a),
Priority to Certain Applications for
Public Facility and Public Housing
Assistance, 42 U.S.C. 5153, shall be for
a period not to exceed six months after
the date of this declaration.Notice is hereby given that pursuant
to the authority vested in the Director of
the Federal Emergency Management
Agency under Executive Order 12148, I
hereby appoint Curtis D. Musgrave of
the Federal Emergency Management
Agency to act as the Federal
Coordinating Officer for this declared
disaster.I do hereby determine the following
areas of the State of Missouri to have
been affected adversely by this declared
major disaster: Jackson and St. Louis
Counties and the City of St. Louis for
Individual Assistance.All counties within the State of
Missouri are eligible to apply for
assistance under the Hazard Mitigation
