AGENCY: Drug Enforcement Administration, Department of Justice.
ACTION: 30-Day notice.

SUMMARY: The Department of Justice (DOJ), Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), will be submitting the following information collection request to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for review and approval in accordance with the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995.

DATES: Comments are encouraged and will be accepted for 30 days until October 10, 2025.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Written comments and suggestions from the public and affected agencies concerning the proposed collection of information are encouraged. Your comments should address one or more of the following four points:

- Evaluate whether the proposed collection of information is necessary for the proper performance of the functions of the agency, including whether the information will have practical utility;
- Evaluate the accuracy of the agency’s estimate of the burden of the proposed collection of information, including the validity of the methodology and assumptions used;
- Enhance the quality, utility, and clarity of the information to be collected; and/or
- Minimize the burden of the collection of information on those who are to respond, including through the use of appropriate automated, electronic, mechanical, or other technological collection techniques or other forms of information technology, e.g., permitting electronic submission of responses.

DOJ seeks PRA authorization for this information collection for three (3) years. OMB authorization for an ICR cannot be for more than three (3) years without renewal. The DOJ notes that information collection requirements submitted to the OMB for existing ICRs receive a month-to-month extension while they undergo review.

Overview of This Information Collection

1. *Type of Information Collection:* Extension without change of a currently Approved Collection.
2. *Title of the Form/Collection:* Annual Reporting for Manufacturers of Listed Chemicals.
3. *Agency form number, if any, and the applicable component of the Department of Justice sponsoring the collection:* No Form number is associated with this collection. The applicable component within the Department of Justice is the Drug Enforcement Administration, Diversion Control Division.
4. *Affected public who will be asked or required to respond, as well as a brief abstract:*
Affected public (Primary): Business or other for-profit.
Affected public (Other): Not-for-profit institutions; Federal, State, Local, and tribal governments.
Abstract: Pursuant to 21 U.S.C. 830(b)(2) and 21 CFR 1310.05(d), manufacturers of listed chemicals must file annual reports of manufacturing, inventory, and use data for the listed chemicals they manufacture. These reports allow DEA to monitor the volume and availability of domestically manufactured listed chemicals, which may be subject to diversion for the illicit production of controlled substances.
5. *Obligation to Respond:* Required to Obtain or Retain Benefits.
6. *Total Estimated Number of Respondents:* DEA estimates that 45 registrants participate in this information collection.
7. *Estimated Time per Respondent:* DEA estimates that it takes 30 minutes per registrant.
8. *Frequency:* once per year.
9. *Total Estimated Annual Time Burden:* DEA estimates that this collection takes 90 annual burden hours.
10. *Total Estimated Annual Other Costs Burden:* \$0.

Notice of Lodging of Proposed Second Material Modification to Consent Decree Under Title VI of the Clean Air Act

On September 4, 2025, the Department of Justice lodged a proposed second material modification to the Consent Decree in the matter entitled *United States v. Trident Seafoods Corp., et. al.* Civil Action 2:19-cv-231, with the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington.

The Consent Decree resolved alleged violations stemming from Trident’s use of ozone-depleting refrigerants on board fishing vessels and at seafood processing facilities in Alaska and in the Pacific Northwest by, among other things, requiring Trident to retrofit or retire a number of its larger refrigeration appliances that are more prone to significant leaks, in accordance with a ten-year schedule. The proposed material modification extends one deadline in the schedule by four years and requires that Trident retrofit or retire one large refrigeration appliance early and agree to additional compliance requirements, including additional inspections and comprehensive leak testing on the vessel whose deadlines are being extended.

The publication of this notice opens a period for public comment on the proposed modification to the Consent Decree. Comments should be addressed to the Assistant Attorney General, Environment and Natural Resources Division, and should refer to *United States v. Trident Seafoods Corp. et al., D.J. Ref. No. 90-5-2-1-11183*. All comments must be submitted no later than thirty (30) days after the publication date of this notice. Comments may be submitted either by email or by mail:

Proposed Exemption for Certain Prohibited Transactions Involving the International Union of Operating Engineers Local Union 627 Training Fund of Oklahoma (the Plan or the Applicant) Located in Oklahoma City, OK

AGENCY: Employee Benefits Security Administration, Labor.

ACTION: Notice of proposed exemption.

SUMMARY: This proposed exemption would permit certain loans from the International Union of Operating Engineers Local Union 627 (Local 627) to the Plan, so the Plan can purchase heavy machinery to fulfill its mission. As described below, absent an exemption, the loans would violate certain prohibited transaction provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

DATES:

Exemption date: If granted, the exemption will be in effect as of the date the grant notice is published in the **Federal Register**.

Comments due: Written comments and requests for a public hearing on the proposed exemption must be received by the Department of Labor by October 27, 2025.

Comments: Persons are encouraged to submit all comments electronically and not to follow with paper copies. Comments should state the nature of the person’s interest in the proposed exemption and how the person would be adversely affected by the exemption, if granted. Any person who may be adversely affected by an exemption can request a hearing on the exemption if their request includes: (1) the name, address, telephone number, and email address of the person making the request; (2) the nature of the person’s interest in the exemption and the manner in which the person would be adversely affected by the exemption; and (3) a statement of the issues to be addressed and a general description of the evidence to be presented at the hearing. The Department of Labor (hereinafter, the Department) will grant a hearing request made in accordance with the requirements above when the Department finds that a hearing is necessary to fully explore material factual issues identified by the requestor, and the Department will publish a hearing notice in the **Federal Register**. The Department may decline to hold a hearing if it finds that: (1) the request for the hearing does not meet the requirements stated above; (2) the only issues identified for exploration at the hearing are matters of law; or (3) the factual issues identified in the request can be fully explored through the submission of evidence in written (including electronic) form.
